


Faith in Action: A Guide for Children & Parents

The Parable of the Sower (Luke 8:5-15)

Jesus tells a parable about a farmer who sows seeds on different types of soil. Only the seeds that fall on good soil grow and produce fruit.

The “soil” represents our hearts. When we listen carefully to God’s Word and live by it, our hearts become good soil where faith can grow.
